“ALL scripture is given by the inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness (II Timothy 3:16).”

1. Begin reading where the last person signed or initialed. Try to begin and end at the end of a chapter.
2. Read with a strong, loud voice. Remember, it is our privilege to have in our hands the entire Word of God. We are truly blessed to be able to read God’s Word in a public place without being arrested or persecuted. The Word of God pierces the darkness and saves souls. We are not trying to read as fast as we can or finish faster than last year. It does not matter how long it takes when we humbly and reverently and with fear and trembling are reading God’s Word in private or in public.
3. Continue to read until you start to become tired and lose strength in your voice. Sign your name or initial where you stopped, and let the next reader know to take over reading.
4. Please only drink water during the time you are reading.
5. Do not answer questions or be disturbed by people who are walking by, talking or trying to distract you from reading. Your other team members will talk and pray with anyone who is interested.
6. Remember we are reading not to just get through the entire Bible, but to impart God’s Truth to those who are hearing and seeing God’s Word being read out loud. “So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, but it shall accomplish what I please, And it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it.”^[1] ^[SEP] Isaiah 55:11. God is working around and through us all the time to accomplish His perfect will.
